Job Title: Assistant Professor in Clinical Psychology (0.2 FTE)

The Purpose of the Role

The Assistant Professor in Clinical Psychology will join the existing team and contribute to teaching and administration on the Doctoral Programme in Clinical Psychology. The successful candidate will provide supervision to postgraduate students and contribute to the international profile of research in psychology in the School of Psychology. There is an expectation that the working week of the successful applicant will include Monday as this is the primary administrative and teaching day for the course.

Context

The Doctorate in Clinical Psychology is an established programme that provides professional training in clinical psychology in collaboration with the Health Service Executive. A core value of the course is an emphasis on the importance of integrating practice and theory, informed by the reflective scientist practitioner model of integrated training in research, practice and personal reflection. Within the three years, the course provides an intensive and systematic programme of training that equips students to meet the challenges of the Irish Health Services.

Main Responsibilities

Teaching

- To assume delegated responsibility for the organization of research methods modules across the academic programme of the D.clin. Psych. course.
- To coordinate the management, supervision and examination of the research dissertations
- To participate in the appraisal of students and other evaluative processes on the D.Clin. course.

- To maintain a level of professional activity consistent with the PSI accreditation requirements.
- To participate in the management and delivery of assigned clinical psychology modules

Research

- To engage in clinically relevant research.
- To manage own continuing professional development

Standard Duties

- To assume delegated responsibility for the organization of research methods modules across the academic programme of the D.Clin. Psych. course.
- To coordinate the management, supervision and examination of the research dissertations
- Supervision and marking of dissertations.
- To engage in the supervision of trainee research.
- Engagement with clinicians involved in clinical research who contribute to the programme.
- To ensure the above is congruent with the overall objectives of the programme and consistent with PSI accreditation standards and those of other relevant accreditation bodies.
- To participate in, and contribute to the maintenance of the accreditation status of the course.
- To function as a member of the Course Executive Committee, Selection Committee, Research Committee and Court of Examiners.
- To participate in the appraisal of students and other evaluative processes on the D.Clin. course.
- To participate in activities related to the development of training in clinical psychology, including attending meetings of Groups of Trainers in Clinical Psychology.
- To maintain a level of professional activity consistent with the PSI accreditation requirements.
- To engage in clinically relevant research.
- To manage own continuing professional development.
- To undertake other duties as directed by the Course Director and Head of School.
- To contribute to the administration of the School as directed by the Head of School.

Person Requirements

- Some experience of teaching and assessing research methods at postgraduate level;
- Advanced knowledge of research methods (quantitative and qualitative) as they relate to the field of applied psychology.;
- Ability to work effectively as a member of a team;
- Ability to contain and support others working in highly demanding training and clinical environments;
- Good communication skills

Qualifications

- The successful candidate will have a doctoral degree in psychology (Ph.D or D.Clin. Psych) and will be professionally qualified in clinical psychology.
- Candidates must be eligible for registered membership of the Psychological Society of Ireland (PSI).
